4. The Pittsburgh Chapter celebrated the 100th birthday of Maj. Scipio White, USA (Ret), center, at its June chapter meeting. He was commissioned in July 1942 and assigned to the 93rd Infantry Division, 594th Field Artillery Battalion. The Division was sent to the South Pacific in 1944. After World War II, White served in Army Reserve units in the Pittsburgh area until he retired in August 1978. The Pittsburgh Chapter made a \$100 contribution to the MOAA Scholarship Fund in White's honor.



Major Scipio White was one of our oldest and most dedicated member throughout the chapter's history.

Keeshan Is A Captain Named Kangaroo

The kindly captain...

THE MAN on the cover of today's TV Graphic may be in disguise, but it's almost a cinch millions of children would recognize him anyway.

Clowning around is how he broke into show business—accidentally.

He's Bob Keeshan, alias "Captain Kangaroo," seen here at 8 a. m. weekdays on Channels 2, 9 and 10.

Long before the captain happened, children knew Keeshan as a clown—not the one on the cover, but Clarabelle of "Howdy

Doody" fame.

"I didn't plan to get into entertainment, period," he said. "I was going to be a lawyer. I was doing research work for one of Bob Smith's writers."

He was referring to the Bob Smith who created "Howdy Doody" and played Buffalo Bob on it.

"Then I found myself involved in acting on tele-

vision," Keeshan said. "And I still intended to be a lawyer. But two or three years later the tail was wearing the dog, and I gave up any thought of law.

"I was given things to do, bring props on and so on. About the second week they said: 'Let's put a clown costume on you so it fits better.'

"I did, and a few weeks after that we designed the makeup and started putting makeup on me and writing material."

Thus, Clarabelle was born in 1947. The impish clown was mute. He (she?) communicated by honking a horn fastened to the box worn on the front of his belt. His trademark was a seltzer bottle, with which he sprayed Buffalo Bob and Chief Thunder Thud.

With his masculine movements and her feminine name, Clarabelle's sex was never clarified.

"We never did decide that," said Keeshan, who left "Howdy" late in 1952 to do a pair of local New York kiddies' shows.

"'The Time for Fun,'" he said, "involved a clown, but that was really transitional for me. It was just coincidental that he happened to be a clown.

"It showed the real life of a clown, not the performing life.

"Then I played Tinker. He was an elderly man, a grandfatherly type—somewhat similar to Captain Kangaroo. He was a toy maker in a toy shop. Tinker was the direct antecedent of Captain Kangaroo."

"Kangaroo" debuted Oct. 3, 1955. For the first seven years, Keeshan traveled a lot to promote the show, "but it got to be really rough after awhile," he said.

Bob Keeshan was born to Irish parents in Lynbrook, New York. After an early graduation in 1945 from Forest Hills High School in Queens, New York, during World War II, he enlisted in the United

States Marine Corps Reserve but was still in the United States when Japan surrendered. He attended Fordham University on the GI Bill. He received his bachelor's degree in education in 1951 and went on to work in Children's television entertainment.
